Project for Human Resources Development Scholarship (JDS)

Overview

JDS provides full scholarship for young leaders from Solomon Islands for Master's and Ph.D. degrees in top Japanese universities

Objective

- To transform knowledge gained in Japan into solutions for national challenges
- To strengthen networks and to foster sustainable bilateral relationship between Japan and partner countries



Young government officials, who are expected to engage in formulating and implementing social economic development plans and are expected to become leaders in Solomon Islands.

Example Fields

What is Expected for JDS Fellows?

To take leadership roles in central gov't positions and contribute to the socio-economic development of their country by actively engaging in policy formulation and implementation of social and economic development policies after completion of program.

Overview

JICA established this program to foster young/mid-career bureaucrats, academicians, and leading human resources in various fields who are capable of influencing policy making processes in Solomon Islands or contributing to socioeconomic development in the near future.

Objective

- To Strengthen a human network between Solomon Islands and Japan in the above-mentioned field

Eligibility

More than 5 years' working experience and More than 6 months working experience at current organizations.

Overview

JICA offers Bachelor's, Master's and Doctoral programs at Japanese universities to develop junior to mid-level government officials, academics, and other leading human resources who can contribute to policymaking or socioeconomic development in Solomon Islands in the near future.

Objective

- To develop high level human resources capable of contributing to and implementing appropriate policy decisions to tackle political and developmental issues in the relevant fields.
- To establish and maintain positive medium- to long-term relations between Solomon Islands and Japan

Eligibility

Junior or mid-level Government officials / Prospective academicians / Personnel expected to help formulate and/or implement policy for achieving Sustainable Developmental Goals.

GX Human Resources Development for Energy Sector Master's 2 years/Ph.D. 3 years

Overview

This program is designed to equip participants with specialized knowledge in Green Transformation within the energy sector, covering policy, economic, and technological levels, to effectively address the challenges of climate change.

Objective

 To develop core human resources such as governmental officials, academias and researchers who contribute to the energy transition toward carbon neutrality in developing countries

Eligibility

More than 2~3 years of working experience at current organizations



Social Science

Energy transition policy and related laws and regulations/Economic analysis of transition model, etc.



Fusion Energy/Nuclear (Next-Generation nuclear power) /Space solar power generation, etc.

Human Resource Development on Public International Law Master's 2 years

Overview

This program provides participants with opportunities to study in Japan to gain specialized knowledge on public international law necessary for addressing public international law affairs in accordance with the rules-based international order.

Objective

To promote target countries capacity to contribute to the rules based international order and share the value and vision of FOIP (Free and Open Indo-Pacific) and Rules-Based International Order

Eligibility

More than 2 years' experience in public international law affairs



Participants are Expected:

- to meet all the requirements to obtain a master's degree within the given period of time
- to deepen specialized knowledge for the public international law
- to regularly report the progress of their studies to JICA
